Title One Parent Notification

Each school in Roseland District and Roseland Charter has a schoolwide Title 1 program. Schoolwide Title I schools receive federal funding for educational programs that ensure that all students, particularly those in need of additional support, can demonstrate proficient and advanced levels of achievement on state academic achievement standards. A schoolwide program (SWP) is a comprehensive reform strategy designed to upgrade the entire educational program in a Title I school. A partnership between home and school is vitally important for student achievement, growth, and learning. Here in Roseland, we are committed to offering ways in which parents can be involved in their child's education and contribute to the school's ongoing improvement plans. We invite parent participation through the following ways:

District/ School Leadership Opportunities:

- **School Site Council** committee that develops a school improvement plan that guides instructional programs that are federally funded for the charter school
- **ELAC** The **ELAC** (**English Language Advisory Committee**) is a committee for parents or other community members who want to advocate for English Learners of the charter school.
- **DELAC** The **DELAC** (**District English Language Committee**) is a committee that develops and reviews the Roseland School District master plan for educational programs for English Learners
- PAC The PAC (Parent Advisory Committee) is a committee of parents that provide a parent voice to the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) which determines the overall goals, actions/services, and budget priorities

Opportunities to Support Your Child:

- Parent Club Meetings monthly meetings designed to educate parents/guardians about school programs, how to support your child at home, academic standards and assessments, involvement with the school community; one parent club meeting annually will be dedicated to discussing the Title I program
- <u>Parent University</u> –(middle and high school) meetings designed to educate families about college, the college application process, grade requirements, financial aid, and scholarship opportunities
- Parent Conferences (K-8) one on one parent/teacher conferences to discuss your child's progress in school and learn ways in which parents can support their child's education.
- <u>Back to School Nights</u> event at the beginning of the year to foster the home and school partnership and communication
- Open House (K-8)/ Awards Nights— events at the end of the year that showcases student learning and achievements for the year
